*Lesson 6 – Make a Drawing or a Collage that Represents Your School

Objectives

Use an artistic medium to represent Talent Elementary School Encourage individual expression through art Put together information learned from previous lessons in a final activity

Materials

Poster board or large drawing paper

Drawing or painting materials (paint, paintbrushes, colored pencils, chalk, markers, etc.)

Glue, scissors

Photos, drawings, magazine pictures, images that show important places at the school, people (students, parents, teachers, visitors), buildings, and/or events from your school Printed words that express what your school is like, or what is important, at the school

- -Talk about how images or single words or phrases can represent a place or an event effectively. If possible, show examples.
- -Decide if the students will create drawings or collages. If they are creating collages, show an example and explain how images, colors, and words are used together to form a larger representation

Note: If the students want to use images from "Then and Now", they can make a "Then and Now" collage or drawing instead of a "Now" piece of art. Teachers can let students choose, or they can ask all students to do the same type of assignment.
